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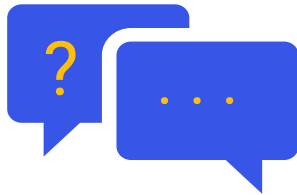

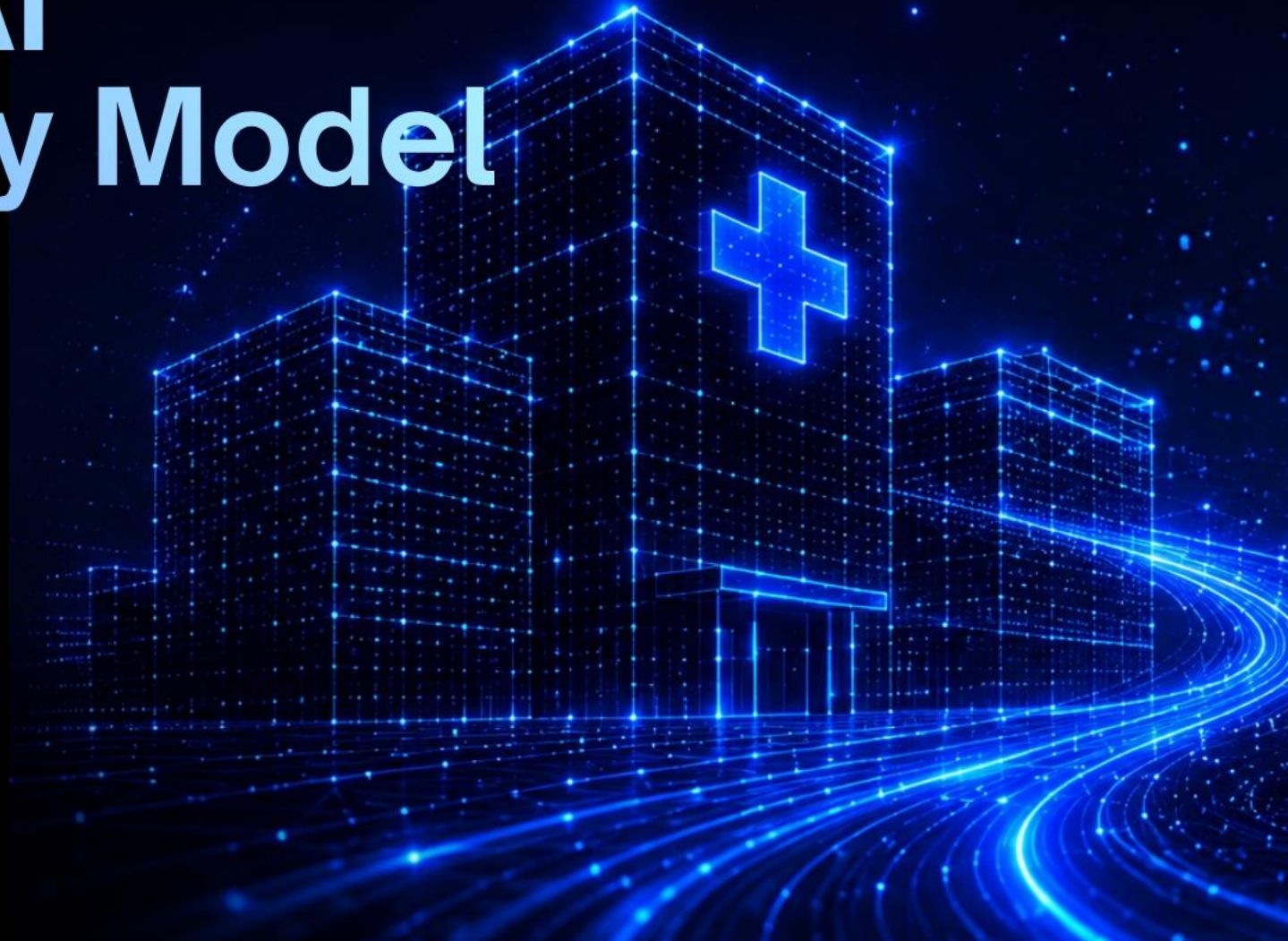

AI in Healthcare Has Moved From Experiment to Infrastructure

AI is now embedded in care delivery, operations, documentation, research, and revenue workflows.

- **81% of physicians** now use AI professionally.
- Health systems are moving beyond “recommendation-only” tools toward **agentic AI** that can execute workflow steps.
- FDA’s AI-enabled medical device list continues to expand, signaling that AI is becoming part of **regulated clinical technology**.
- The governance question is no longer “Should we use AI?”; it is **“Who is accountable when AI affects care, compliance, or data?”**

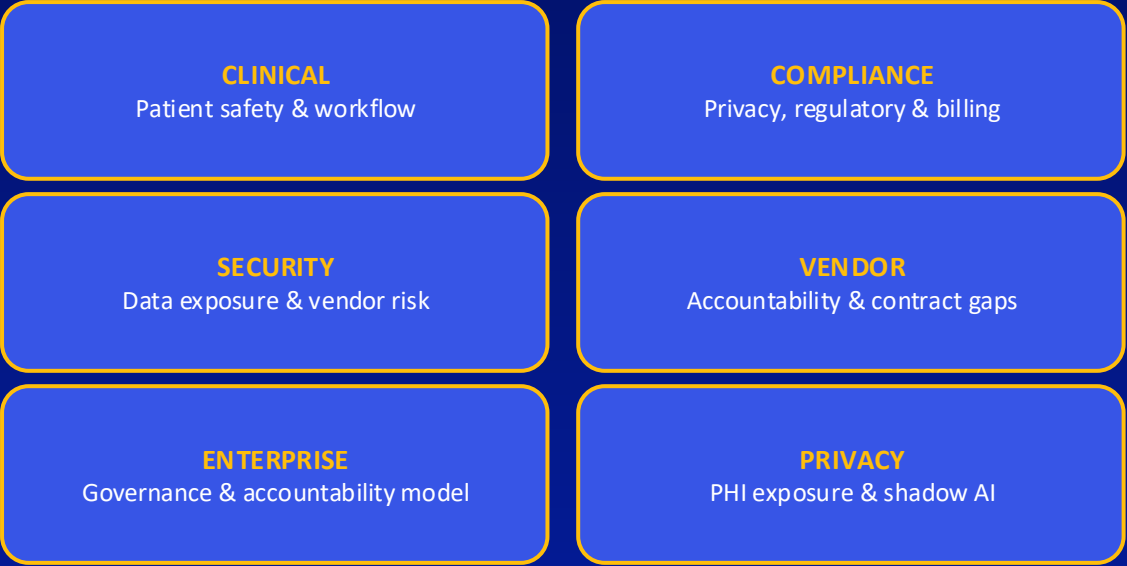

The Risk Is Expanding **Faster Than Ownership**

AI risk is not one risk. It is clinical, compliance, privacy, security, vendor, and enterprise risk.

- Governance committees exist, but operating controls lag: **84%** report AI governance committees, but only **59%** have a documented approval process.
- Only about **10%** use automated monitoring to detect AI capabilities; many rely on ad hoc discovery or vendor notes.
- Top concerns include **hallucinations, automation bias, shadow AI, PHI exposure, and unclear vendor accountability.**
